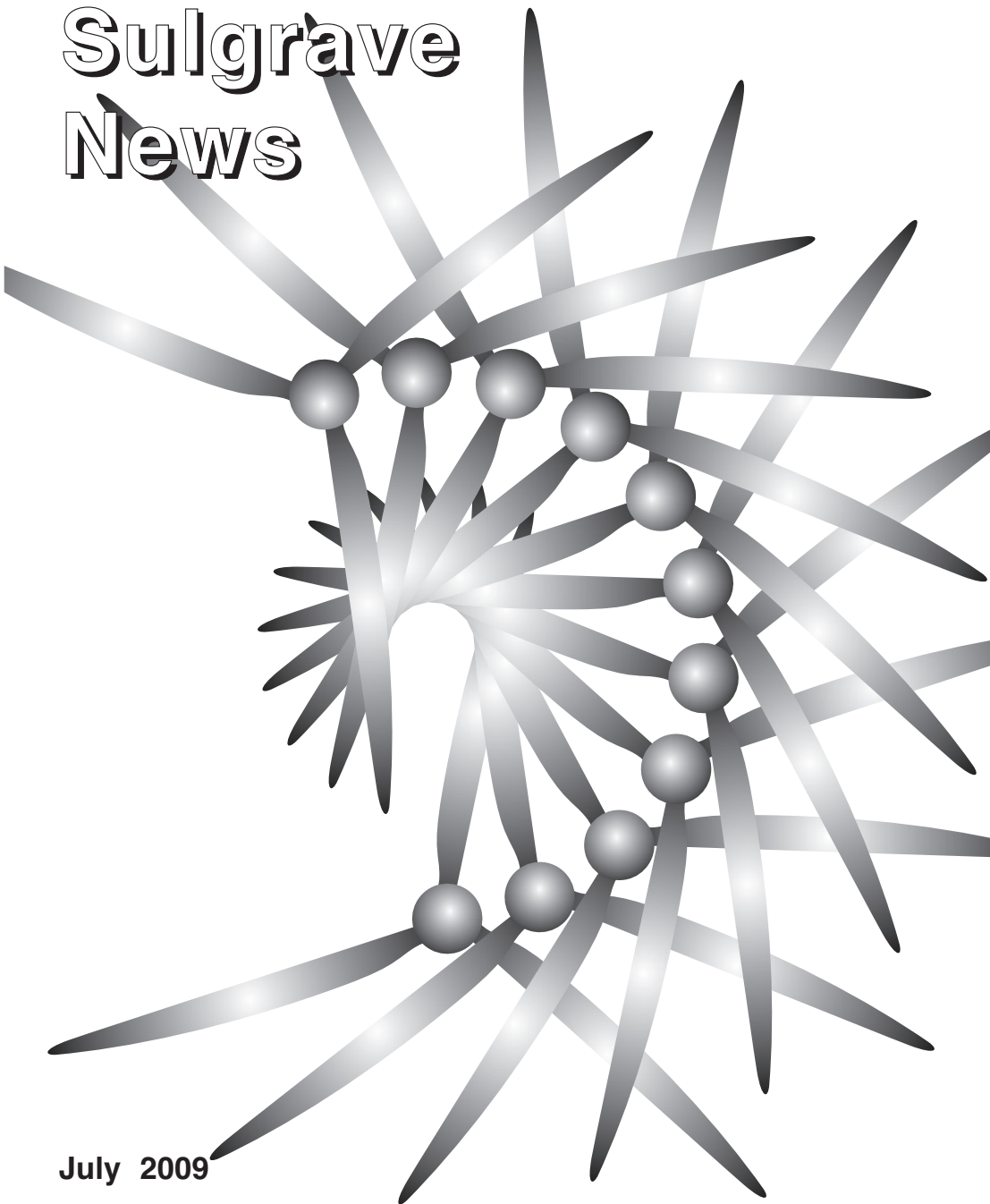

Lots of Hot Air!

There are two notices in this newsletter which I feel I should draw to your attention; one is the monthly Parish Council Meeting, and the other a special Open Meeting, at Sulgrave Manor. Both are due to discuss the proposed building of wind turbines at Weston. I took the time to visit the Enertrag website, and found a map which indicated the proposed location of the nine turbines, and was surprised to find that they are closer to Sulgrave (the nearest not much more than half a mile away) than Weston. From my vague knowledge of the landscape, it would appear to me that the visual impact from Sulgrave will be greater, as Weston is mainly on the reverse slope of the ridge on which they will be placed! All nine will sit squarely in the view from Sulgrave Manor!

I would therefore like suggest that you attend these meetings, so that you are fully informed of this proposal, and can make your feeling known.

Cover - Wind Turbines over Sulgrave?

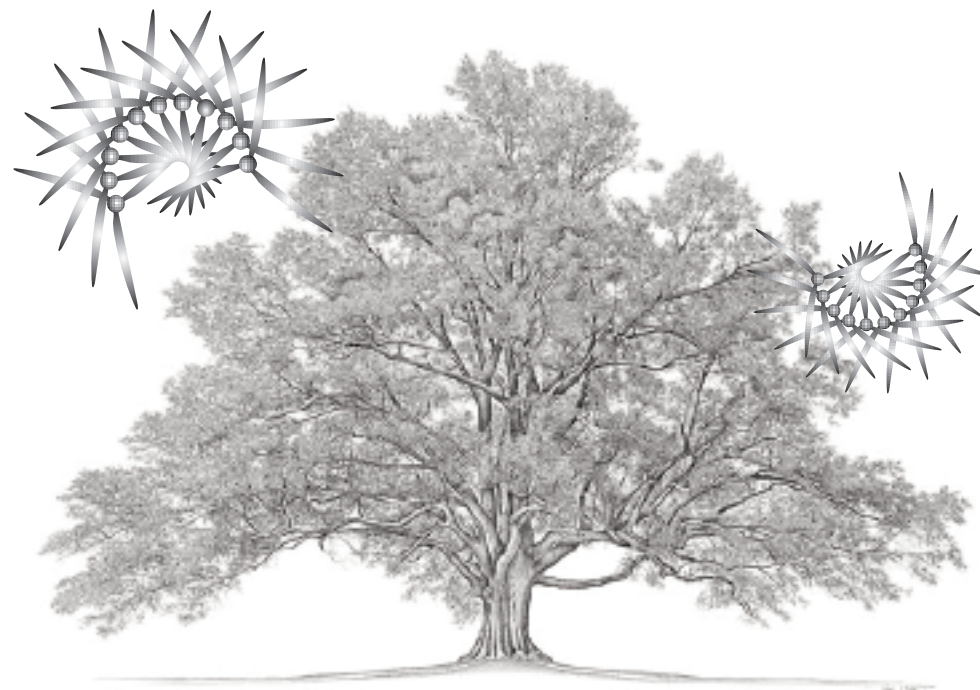
SULGRAVE WOOD

It's now ten years since the wood was planted, and it's growing well. As at least some of us know (is it Sulgrave's best-kept secret?), the wood is a peaceful spot to stroll, or to sit and chat, or to sit and read, or dream. Or just sit

But now, for the first time, damage has been done to some of the trees; branches have been broken off, and bark has been stripped off - this can be more serious, as it can bring about the death of the tree. Grey squirrels may do this sort of thing, which is why they are not the forester's best friends. This time, it was because of human activity, and no, it wasn't a case of vandalism, which is damage for damage's sake. It was caused by young people making themselves a "den". Of course, it has always been the usual thing for children to have fun, making a den; I myself did it when I was young. However, it is important to observe an unwritten rule: the materials should be whatever comes to hand, but without damage to the environment. So fallen branches are O.K., and odd bits of timber and suchlike, but it should not be necessary to gather living wood or plant material.

I hope therefore that parents whose children frequent the wood or the Pocket Park will emphasise to them the importance of **NOT** damaging trees, shrubs or other vegetation.

We would also like to thank friends who donated plastic bags, and those who came to buy.

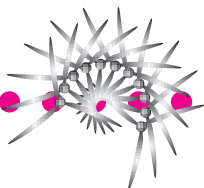
We have been able to send £118 to The Associated Country Women of The World.

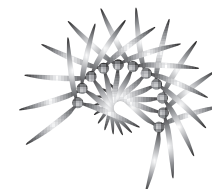

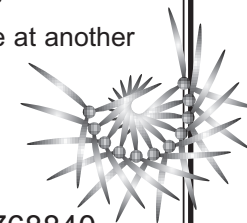

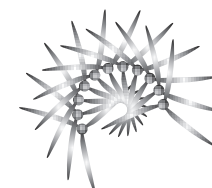
