
Refreshments will be served and it will be a good opportunity to get some feedback from you and maybe get some fresh ideas.

SOS from the Sulgrave Knitting & Sewing Group

In the past we have knitted items for Charity, such as knee rugs for the Katharine House Hospice, The cottage Hospital, Brackley and for deserving cases. Our local church has benefited from our knitting.

Currently we are knitting knee rugs for the Cottage Hospital, Brackley and cot blankets for the Baby Unit at the Horton Hospital.

Recently, at their request, we delivered one hundred knitted Easter chicks to the Katharine House Hospice and are presently adding to this figure. We are also knitting mini Christmas puddings as both of these items are such good money spinners for the Hospice fund raising effort.

We urgently need knitting wool, felt and embroidery threads.

- Double knitting, all colours for knee rugs
- Double knitting <u>BABY</u> wool, pastel colours for cot blankets
- Any shade of yellow double knitting for chicks
- Dark brown double knitting and white double knitting wool for mini Christmas puddings
- Felt for beaks and neckties (all colours)
- Dark green felt for holly leaves on the puddings
- Stranded silk embroidery threads, all shades

Some of these items may be lingering in your cupboards, just waiting to be used in a good cause or you may, when shopping in town, be kind enough to buy for us some wool or felt. Whatever the quantity, large or small, the Group would be very grateful.

Message:	With the TV digital switchover happening at the end of March please be aware of Bogus Callers knocking on your door offering to retune your televisions. These people will deliberately target the elderly and vulnerable who may have concerns about the switchover, and their intention will be to enter the property and steal money, handbags and other small items of value. There are organisations that will help with the switchover, and their employees will carry identification, please ensure that before you let anyone into your property that you have had a good look at any identification offered, and that you feel comfortable about them being there. The best policy would be to ask a relative or trusted neighbour to help and advise you with the retune, and not let strangers into your house. <u>If you have any concerns about a caller at your door</u> <u>particularly during this period then please make sure you call</u> the police on 03000 111 222

Sulgrave Housing Need Survey results

As you may be aware South Northamptonshire Council has been working with Sulgrave Parish Council to find out if there is a need for affordable housing in Sulgrave. A survey was carried out last November and the results have now been collated and a report produced.

The report found that:

Five households want to move in the next five years.

Three of these households have at least one person needing to move within Sulgrave Parish who have a genuine housing need, resulting in a need for four affordable homes for rent.

47% of respondents would definitely be in favour of a small scale affordable housing development and a further 38% might support development. 15% of respondents were opposed to development.

The main concerns of respondents were that a new development may not be in keeping with the village, that there is poor public transport and an increase in traffic congestion could result from development.

All of those who need to move and want to live in the parish have a strong local connection to Sulgrave. A local connection is usually defined as someone that has lived in the parish for at least 3 years, has previously lived in the parish, has relatives in the parish or is currently working or undertaking education in the parish.

South Northamptonshire Council would like to thank those residents who took part in the survey. Draft Notes from Parish Council Meeting held 10th March 2011

Introduction

The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Confirmation of minutes of last meeting held on 27th January 2011

The minutes of the meeting held on 27th January were agreed and signed as a true record. This was proposed by Cllr Kellett and seconded by Cllr Waite.

Matters Arising

Jubilee Trust Fund

From the last meeting, letters were sent to signatories of the Jubilee Trust Fund (which was set up in 1975) to ask if the account could be transferred over and the money used for a street party for the Diamond Jubilee next year. One of the signatories has objected to this suggestion so it may be an idea for a committee to be formed to decide what to do with the money. The Parish Council are perfectly justified to look at some kind of celebration as the Government are supporting the co-ordination of Diamond Jubilee celebrations in communities.

Housing Needs Letter

Cllr Pollak asked to see a copy of the letter that was sent to SNC.

Forthcoming Elections

The Chair noted that Cllr Kellett would not be standing for election in May. The Clerk has nomination papers and they need to be returned to SNC by 4th April 2011. Election details are also on the website.

Guest Speaker, Mark McVitty of SNC to talk about 'ACE' Initiative (Active Cycling for Everyone)

Mark McVitty attended the meeting to talk about Active Cycling For Everyone which has been inspired by the 2012 Olympics. It is about re-creating a culture of cycling in the village of South Northants. People in this country are doing less exercise and we have the highest obese rate ever. Mr McVitty then went onto describe various riding activities that he is involved in. He spoke about a mountain biking day which was held three years ago, there is a leisure ride which meets in Towcester every Thursday morning. It is mostly ladies who ride and there are 20 regular riders. Mark is involved in coaching schools and after school clubs. Mark noted that he has received funding from Northants Sport to train leaders and the leaders then go back to their own village to get others involved. This was followed by a question and answer session. The Parish Council thanked Mark for attending the meeting.

Councillors Reports

Pocket Park

Cllr Osborne talked about a successful working party weekend which took place at Pocket Park to clear away all the vegetation and most of the play equipment has also now been removed. Four parish councillors helped that weekend and many, many volunteers (some taking up the whole of their weekend). Huge thanks from all the Sulgrave Pocket Park Action Group to all those who helped.

In relation to whether neighbours have been consulted, Cllr Osborne replied that there was an open day consultation down at the park back in May and the Action Group have based their project on the evaluation of this village consultation. There will be a final design consultation on the park equipment via an open house as soon as the Action Group have come up with the placing of the final design for the play equipment and this has been re-drawn by the supplier.

The path will completely follow the boundary line down to the pond for disabled people to access. Originally this was going to be made of grass matting, but all contractors who quoted for the works pointed out that the path would not be visible once the grass had grown and therefore it would need to have a defining barrier of posts in order to ensure that wheelchairs did not inadvertently change surface, this is not acceptable from a health and safety point on view nor from an ongoing maintenance point of view and the path will therefore now be made of green tarmac, work to start shortly. The dipping platform at the pond will be made of Millboard recycled decking, the unanimous vote was for type Weathered Vintage Oak, the ecological surveyor and/or a representative from Natural England will be attending at the pond on installation of this dipping platform in order to ensure neither the liner, nor the newts are disturbed in any way.

There will be a launch party at the end of June for the opening and there is also due to be another event to raise funds for this launch happening in May, Sulgrave Manor have agreed to donate the venue - more details to follow.

In relation to Forest Schools, the Parish Council agreed that Cllr Osborne would contact Lis Stuart. Subsequently Cllr Osborne has written to all parish councillors to request that there are definitive guidelines for what the Parish Council is allowing Forest Schools to do down at the park.

Street Lighting

Cllr Kellett has been looking at self contained solar powered lights of which some are available. A consultant has contacted the Parish Council to offer his help but he charges £28 per hour. There are three UK suppliers and the current units will cease in 2015. There are two versions available. The current units are 3700 lumens and the new ones would be between 4500-6000 lumens. They could be bought with a pole or bracket or put on existing poles. The cost is £3000 each and if 20 or more are purchased, there is a discount of 20% available. The overall cost to purchase all units would be £65K. There is more research to be done. Cllr Kellett looked at loans from the Carbon Free Trust but the Parish Council are not eligible.

Castle Green

Cllr Pollak noted that the new contractors who had worked on the capping of the wall are waiting for their second payment. The Castle Green Committee have nearly finished the grant application for the final grant payment. There is a sum of money that was retained by the committee and this is due to be paid 6 months after completion of work. This sum will be due at the beginning of April. Cllr Pollak has contacted the Rhodes Partnership who have suggested they will call either this month or early next month to look for any snags in the workmanship of the wall. They have assured the committee that any problems will be put right. The Rhodes Partnership to suggest a date as there are sharp frosts at night still. In the meantime Cllr Pollak and Mr Martin Sirot-Smith will have a look at the wall themselves.

Planning Applications

One new planning application had been received since the last meeting.

- *S/2011/1093/FUL, Conservatory to rear at The Cottage, Magpie Road.* Currently in circulation within council.
- To receive an update on Spring Ridge Farm planning application. The old case officer has left and the application is now being looked after by Mike Warren. All representations are in and SNC are due to meet with the applicant soon. The application is unlikely to go to committee before May. From the floor, Mr Christy advised that he had spoken to the Case Officer whilst visiting SNC about something else and SNC have taken interest with the photos. They are reconsidering the photos in light of the ones submitted by the Action Group. SNC are also waiting for news of bats and the breeding season. The application should be looked at on the 19th May. The Chair advised that they had not been notified of this date formally but someone would try to attend and represent the council. Mr Christy concluded by noting that 771 objections letters had been received but there is still the opportunity for more letters to be sent in.

<u>Open Forum</u>

• Mr Christy spoke about the HS2 public consultation document which is huge and covers seven questions which have to be responded to. The consultation has just begun and will run until 29th July 2011. He suggested that an open meeting is held, separate to a Parish Council meeting in April/May. The Chair agreed that this should be arranged by Mr Christy.
