A big thank you for all who visited and those who opened their gardens and allotments for the National Garden Scheme (NGS) on Sunday 19th June.

Also a big thank you to all traffic directors, car parkers, tea pourers, cake slicers etc. Thank you also to the Church Hall (Roger) for crockery and parking; also to Castle Green (Peter) for parking

We had 228 visitors and raised £1396.00. This is lower than 2009 but that was a bumper year when we raised £2147 on the Sunday opening and 398 visitors attended.

More importantly our contributions go towards the charities supported by the NGS: Macmillan Cancer Support, Marie Curie Care, Help the Hospices, Cross Roads, The Queen's Nursing Institute, Perennial (Gardeners' Royal Benevolent Fund), National Trust, Royal Fund for Gardeners' Children. Since 1927 apparently £35 million has been raised for charity and currently of each £1 you give 80p goes straight to the charities supported by the NGS.

We open biennially for the NGS and if you would like to be included next time (probably 2013) please contact me. No garden can be too small or large or not good enough, together we balance out.

Introduction

The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Confirmation of minutes of last meeting held on 12th May 2011

The minutes of the meeting held on 12th May were agreed and signed as a true record

Matters Arising

Jubilee Trust Fund/Diamond Jubilee Celebrations

The Parish Council had previously agreed to support village celebrations next year for the Queens Diamond Jubilee. The original proposal was to use the funds from the Jubilee Trust account to hold a street party but this was not the ideal solution.

From the Floor, Wendy Barnes of Sulgrave Manor advised that the government have recently announced there will be a four day celebration from 3rd - 6th June 2012 to mark this event. Wendy suggested that the site at Sulgrave Manor could be used for a village lunch. The Chair thanked Wendy for this offer. He felt a committee should be formed to decide on the celebration and the Parish Council could consider making a financial provision when setting their precept in January 2012. From the floor Susie

Blayney (SB) noted that she had carried out her own research and everyone she had spoken to, supported the idea 100%, this included young people. SB noted that she would be happy to be involved in a committee. Wendy suggested that Cheryl Moss, who works at the Manor is co-opted onto the committee to help with practical constraints.

Action: A note to be put in the newsletter and website asking for a committee to be set up. Item to be put on the agenda next month.

Pocket Park

The launch will now take place on 2nd July 12-4pm and not 25th June as previously advised.

Parking on Magpie Road

South Northants Homes have confirmed they are in touch with the contractor and putting the information together. Cllr Waite has not seen the proposals yet.

Annual Report 2010/11

The Chair handed out copies to the councillors for their comments. Once they have been printed a certain amount of copies will be placed in the shop and the report put on the website.

To receive an update on progress of work in Pocket Park

Cllr Osborne confirmed the park will reopen on 2nd July and the whole of the village will be invited. A Teddy bears picnic is planned. Some of the play equipment has already been installed. A spotters board with animals and plants on and a blackboard will be placed near the pond.

Cllr Osborne spoke about the tree at the entrance to the park which is leaning forward and starting to uproot. The man in the neighbouring house would like the tree to stay as it provides privacy for him. Cllr Osborne showed George Metcalfe the tree and he said if it is taken down, it must be replaced with another tree.

Action: The Parish Council to look at the tree and ask for a professional opinion from a tree surgeon.

Cllr Osborne had looked at the fence between Pocket Park and Nashes Yard. A new fence would either have to be placed on the other side or trees would have to be cut down. A suggestion was made for the existing hedge to be laid. From the floor, Digby Lewis suggested that Christopher Magnay should be contacted as he had laid a hedge of his own recently.

Action: The Chair/Cllr Osborne to speak to Christopher Magnay. Cllr Waite to ask for advice about hedge laying from the Tree Surgeon.

Cllr Osborne then spoke about the woodland where it is evident that trees have been cut down and left. There are big branches which have been left in the main park area and an oak tree has been cut down and left in the wood. Cllr Osborne would like it cleared before 2nd July.

Action: The Chair and Cllr Osborne to speak to Mr Maudant as he may know who has cut the trees down

A discussion took place about claiming back VAT and the Parish Clerk confirmed she can claim back VAT monthly. It was then agreed by all that Parish Council funds would be released to cover cashflow timing and this money would be replaced by the lottery grant when received. It was also agreed to transfer £5924 from the Pocket Park Account to the main account. £1 would be left in the account to keep it open.

Cllr Osborne had met George Metcalfe who advised he had sent a letter to the Parish Council to advise of his resignation of Tree Warden. A huge vote of thanks was given to him for all his work over the years. The post of Pocket Park Warden can now be advertised as work is nearly complete. It was suggested that a sign advertising for Pocket Park Warden is put on the Pocket Park gate on the launch date.

The Parish Clerk to amend the insurance documents to include the new play equipment which has cost £57K.

b) Approval and Signature of Annual Return 2010/11

The Annual Return for 2010/11 was presented to the council and Sections 1 and 2 were duly approved and signed by the Chair and Responsible Financial Officer. Audit notices are now up on the notice-board.

Planning Applications

To receive an update on Spring Ridge Farm planning application.

The Parish Councils objection notice was sent to SNC in December but new documents have been submitted by Broadview Energy relating to issues previously raised by the objection letters. SNC have asked for comments by 13.06.11. The previous arguments made are still valid. It was agreed the original colour bound file should be

resent with a brief note picking out key arguments such as the Landscape and Visual Impact Assessment.

A members pre-committee site visit has been arranged for 21^{st} June. Cllr Waite has agreed to attend this meeting.

Action: The Parish Clerk to ask for timings of this meeting.

An SNC Development Control meeting has been arranged for 30^{th} June when the Parish Council can be represented and speak for three minutes. The Chair has agreed to attend this meeting.
