Notice to Dog Walkers and Public Footpath Users

It has come to my attention for some time now that a number of persons are not observing the countryside code with regards to the use of public foot paths and keeping our beautiful countryside tidy. I would like to remind people that they have the right to walk the line of a public footpath and that to stray off the footpath is trespass, this is happening regularly on land that I farm. With regards to walking a dog on a public footpath it is not a legal requirement to have a dog on a lead, however the dog must be under control and stay on the footpath at all times.

On the subject of tidiness, would the person(s), not a dog! who has left 3 plastic bags of dog excrement by the clap gate into The Big Green (the long grass field below Sulgrave Manor) please collect it on their return, and kindly refrain from doing so again. It could cause considerable digestive upset to livestock if it were consumed by them.

A reminder that, under the National Gardens Scheme, seven village gardens are open to the public on SUNDAY 31st MAY, from 2pm to 6pm.

The gardens are:- The Cottage, Magpie Road Threeways, Little Street Rectory Farm, Little Street Eagle House, Helmdon Road Ferns, Helmdon Road Sulgrave Manor The Herb Society Garden at Sulgrave Manor

Combined admission to all gardens - £5 (children free) (Sorry, no dogs)

"What!" I may hear you say, "why pay $\pounds 5$ to look at gardens in my own village? - I've seen them all already!" Well, there are several reasons why you might do so. First, seven gardens for $\pounds 5$ - that's only about 72p per garden - seems quite a bargain. Second, you probably haven't seen all the gardens - some are not visible from the road, and in any case two gardens are new to the scheme. Also, this is a chance to chat to the various gardeners (they're usually happy to talk about their hobby), to ask questions, to find out which particular features or plants are their joy, to talk over gardening problems (or the occasional disaster!)

Then, when your legs grow weary, you can sit and have tea and cake at Asby House (Sulgrave's cakes are widely celebrated!) Don't forget also that at Ferns a good range of home-grown hardy perennial plants are available, at bargain prices.

All in all, it should be a good afternoon out. And the final decider, <u>all</u> takings, from admission, teas and plants, will go to the NGS approved charities: Macmillan, Marie Curie, The Queen's Nursing Institute, Carers Trust, Perennial (formerly the Gardeners' Royal Benevolent Fund) and Parkinson's UK.
