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
### ADVENT WINDOWS

We can now proudly announce that we cracked the £150,000 turnover figure for 2016 -that's £12,000 up on 2015. So well done to everyone who has contributed to this trading success. Trading has been strong in all areas and hot drinks sales from our fancy machine have been a particularly successful addition. January has started off well and all signs are that the shop will continue to flourish.

By the time you read this there should be a flush of new wines on the shop shelves. Plenty of cheap and cheerfuls as usual - but also a few premium wines for the more discerning. Our star red is undoubtedly the Appassimento which usually runs out rather quickly as a few customers like it so much they buy it by the case. It is made from four varieties of grape which are allowed to dry on the vines until they almost become raisins. The resultant wine is concentrated and enormously fruity with a strong backbone of tannins and acidity. It usually sells for about £15 a bottle so, at £9.95, it is an absolute steal. The quality white is the Domaine de Maubet which is made from a blend of traditional Gascony grapes and used to be the 'house white' at the Park Lane Hotel in London. A bargain at £8.95. Some wine prices have been hit by the decline in the value of the pound since Brexit but we have absorbed much of the increase and most of our wine prices remain unchanged for the time being. A couple of other interesting wines to try are the Cintia Fernao Peres – a delightfully zesty Portuguese white at £7.35 and the cherry and raspberry flavoured Ontañon organic Rioja which is available on line at £11 a bottle and which we sell for £8.95.

Some new lines in the shop this month include a selection of Shaw's luxury chutneys, 'Mr Organic' add-in sauces, 'Urban' instant noodles and some different flavours of fudge from 'Burnt Sugar'. In addition to our freshly cooked pasties and sausage rolls, we now offer a really tasty 'Hot Burger Bar' which is a combination of burger, cheese and relish which will undoubtedly get the thumbs up from Sulgrave's transient population of workman.

With St Valentine's Day creeping up, keep an eye open for some romantic special offers and also bunches of flowers which we plan to stock for special occasions. Some super new cards have recently been added to the racks so check those out next time you drop in.

Thanks to Claire Sadler, the shop's Facebook page is now being regularly updated so that you can keep track of updates, special offers and new lines. Please keep the 'likes' going and spread the word to all your contacts.

### Pocket Park Works

The boundary hedgerow at the far end of the Pocket Park has recently been thinned out to allow light to penetrate the wood and encourage growth but the hedgerow still requires attention to allow it to thicken and produce a strong and well defined boundary for the future.


This additional work will result in the hedgerow being significantly reduced in the short term but recovery is expected over the next growing season, following which it may be practical to "lay" the hedgerow and produce an attractive feature more suitable for ongoing management.

During the time the hedgerow re-establishes itself some of the off-cuts from the work will be used as a barrier, while this may look unsightly at first, it will protect the hedgerow as it grows and will increase safety in the area by helping to prevent access to the adjacent field where horses are often kept.

If you or your children use the Pocket Park, please make sure that you and they keep well away from the work area and boundary. The Parish Council thanks you for helping to keep our Pocket Park a safe and enjoyable space."



### Draft Notes from Parish Council Meeting held 5th January 2017

#### **Election of Chairman**

Cllr Roberts was elected to be Chairman. The Chairman will be standing down in May.

## To approve and sign the minutes of last meeting held on 12<sup>th</sup> May, 10<sup>th</sup> November and 8<sup>th</sup> December 2016

The minutes were all approved and accepted by the council.

#### Matters Arising

*Transfer of Land* - Concerns were raised before Christmas that the legal fees were rising. Lewis Thomas has confirmed that legal costs will remain at £500.00 despite the delays. It is hoped the matter can be concluded soon.

*Church Organ Fund* - A letter of support was sent to Libbie Foster by Andrew Waite (previous Chairman). The Parish Clerk has made enquiries but unfortunately there is no legal power for the Parish Council to give a donation to the fund.

#### To discuss future use of the adopted pay-phone kiosk

In November 2016 the Parish Council agreed to adopt the kiosk and repurpose it into something else that would benefit the village. A community engagement exercise was undertaken to seek ideas from the village and this concluded on 31st December 2016. 23 community members provided a total of seven suggestions. The suggestions included a library, housing for defibrillator, open bar, dog shower, community greenhouse, complete removal of kiosk and replace with tables and chairs for shop patrons and a village guide. As there are difficulties in providing water to the kiosk and it being open to the elements it was agreed the following suggestions could not be considered, open bar, library, community greenhouse, dog shower and tables and chairs for shop patrons. It was agreed that the best use would be dual use for a defibrillator and village guide. These ideas will be explored further. A final decision to be made at the February meeting.

#### To discuss repairs/modifications to street lighting

There are two properties in the village who have asked for shields to reduce the light brightness. The Chairman to ask T Clarke if the two lanterns (6 & 11) can be dimmed permanently.

#### To discuss the maintenance of hedgerows and verges

It was noted that Ian Cherry has been busy in the village tiding around the Manor and Little Street. The long hedge has been trimmed at the bottom of Pocket Park. A vote of thanks was given and a letter will be sent to him.

### To discuss essential work to Pocket Park

There is essential hedgerow work to be done in Pocket Park. The proposal is to cut down 60 yards of the existing hedge to slightly above ground level and use the off-cuts to block the gaps whilst the hedgerow recovers. The work will be done before the end of January. It was agreed to set aside a budget figure of £500.00. Mr Fonge and Mr Osman will do the work. A note will be put in the newsletter.

There is a large tree in the corner which is hazardous and may be dead but the tree roots are on land belonging to Sulgrave Farm. The Parish Council will speak to the land owner.

#### **Councillors Reports**

The ash tree die back problem was discussed. It was agreed to order a tree pack from Woodland Trust later in the year.

Cllr Daniels has agreed to put together an asset management plan in conjunction with Councillors and the community as he has some experience in this area.

A HS2 briefing document has been circulated.

### **Finance Report**

There were no payments to approve.

#### To set the precept for 2017/18

A budget sheet was prepared and circulated. Precepts will not be capped this year but might be for 2018/19. It was agreed to set the precept at £13,500.00 for 2017/18 which is an 8% increase from last year.

### **Planning Applications**

Two applications had been received since the last meeting:

- S/2016/3085/FUL, Erection of stable block at The Watermill, Stockwell Lane. No objections.
- S/2016/2785/FUL, remove part of front boundary wall to allow new vehicular access and off road parking in front garden at 13 Spinners Cottages, Magpie Road. The application was withdrawn.

#### Open Forum

The matter of a crow scarer being used early in the morning on Helmdon Road was reported. Mr Fonge agreed to find out the correct time that one can be used.
