Fresh bread:

Delivered 3 times a week from The Brackley Bakery "Caked in Bread" to the Shop. During week a small range of white, granary & wholemeal loaves will be available along with crusty rolls, baguettes & ciabatta. On Saturdays we will have all the regular weekly breads with a limited range of specialty breads such as Sour Dough, Rye & Spelt. Some flavoured breads such as basil, tomato & mozzarella, garlic, parsley & cheese or caramelised onion & thyme will also be available (although these are subject to availability so get up early to avoid disappointment or call us to reserve it for you to collect later).

You can also place special order for the entire range available from Caked in Bread (detailed order forms & prices available from shop) – NOTE orders need to be placed on Mondays, Wednesdays & Fridays before 12 o'clock though.

Fruit & Vegetables:

It's Asparagus & Strawberry season! What cream would you like with your strawberries? We now have some lovely Cornish clotted cream as well as our regular Jersey single & double cream; spoilt for choice!

Don't forget Hollandaise sauce or butter to go with the local Asparagus.
