Village Shop News Update Shop Telephone – 01295 760066

Let me start this month's update with an apology. I said last month that you'd be able to use your debit cards to make purchases in our Shop & you couldn't; on the ball as ever! You can however now use them, the machine is in place, linked up & operating (I checked with Sharon that this is still the case just before sitting down to write this). So you can now buy goods & pay money into your Reverse Credit Account using your plastic. We'll be monitoring how things progress over the coming weeks but initially we'll be taking debit cards for payment when transactions are over £5 in total. If there are any changes to this then we'll put a notice up in the Shop & I'll include it in the next Shop Update.

This is hopefully going to be a significant service improvement for you all in making it easier to pop in for those odd bits and pieces even when the wallet is 'cash light'. The last few months trading have not been brilliant in all honesty. July sales were down significantly on the same period last year (13%) with the cumulative performance for the first 7 months of 2014 down 5% on 2013. Although if the difference is broken down, as follows then catching up the deficit doesn't sound too bad. If everybody were to spend an extra £1 per week (a chocolate bar, bag of crisps ... doesn't sound much when you put it like that) for the remaining 21 weeks of the year then we can get back on track to matching our record year in 2013. If we're missing a product that you particularly want then do please let Sharon know in the Shop & we'll look to rectify things wherever possible. I see that there are still a number of builders around the village; please let them know where the Shop is & encourage them to use it.

Sharon has also been told by the Post Office that the existing red post box outside the Old Village Stores is to be removed we believe from the middle of September. Re-siting it (not sure as to where yet) will take 38 weeks from the date of removal so if you want to post your letters then drop them into the Shop & we'll put them in our collection bag for you. If the Shop is closed then put them through the letter box & they will be put into the bag for the next collection.

Don't forget to keep the evening of October 3rd at The Star free in your diary because you are invited to join us to celebrate your Shop's 10th birthday. Keep an eye out in the Shop for more details but for now, we hope to see you at some point in the evening for a bite to eat & a birthday drink or two! We're also planning a special cake celebration on September 20th (which is our actual 10th birthday) outside the Shop for the younger members of the village; again keep an eye out for more details.
