I'm delighted to bring you more good news about your Village Shop & Post Office! Our takings for January & February 2012 were ahead of the same weeks in 2011 in 6 out of 8 weeks; an overall increased performance of 2.4% so thank you again to you all for your custom & support!

I said in the last Newsletter that the Management Committee were planning on delivering against 3 things this year & I'd like to give you a quick update on them:

1. Locally sources, fresh local produce

David & Joanna are working hard to ensure that the fruit & vegetables that we have in stock match their seasonality.

We now have in stock a range of hand made, home cooked pies from Elliotts of Towcester. If you haven't tried their pork pies or chicken & ham pies then, as a 'pie aficionado', I can thoroughly recommend them; they are quite simply delicious & great value for money!

We have a new range of Gourmet Cookies from Borders in 6 flavours; again a real treat for morning coffee, tea or when you fancy treating yourself.

New for the week ends are our freshly baked, almond croissants. Why not try them with a cup of our Grumpy Mule coffee?

Finally, David has asked me to remind you to get your orders into him for Bread over the Easter period. We get deliveries of fresh bread from our baker every Saturday morning so don't miss out!

2. New computer system

This really is an essential change to the Shop so that we can become more responsive to the way in which we serve you, our Customers. Debit & credit card payments are very much the norm these days & we have narrowed our preferred choice of system down to 2. I hope that I'll be able to tell you more in the next Newsletter.

3. Broadening awareness of the Shop & Post Office

I'm delighted to say that we have agreed a joint promotion with Will & Mandy at The Star which will run throughout April as a thank you to everyone for your continued support. More details are shown in the separate feature; I do hope that you'll enjoy the benefit of the offer! This is the first initiative of this kind for both businesses & we feel that a collaborative approach for our community will create stronger awareness.

We'll all be aware of the increases in fuel prices; they effect us all. I did a quick calculation of the cost to make a round trip to Middleton Cheney. I know, it's sad but I think that it's important that people are aware of these costs because it makes the Shop all the more attractive. At today's prices, a petrol car will cost around £2.15 & a diesel car around £1.75 for the 12 mile journey.

Finally, the Management Committee wanted to express a HUGE vote of thanks to Geoff Ratley & Town & Country Builders for their support in providing free of charge maintenance work for the Shop. Some of you may have noticed that the plaster in the Shop has been attended to which will allow us to complete the re-decoration. Geoff completed this work for us & I know that he'd be delighted to hear from villagers & your friends should you need any building or maintenance work around

1. **Apologies**

Cllr's Harding and Powell, Jill Barrett

2. **Declaration of Interest**

Cllr Pollak declared that she owns Sulgrave Castle Mound.

Confirmation of minutes of last meeting held on 9th February 2012

The minutes of the meeting held on 9th February 2012 were agreed and signed as a true record. This was proposed by Cllr Pollak and seconded by Cllr Waite.

3b. Matters Arising

Beech Tree Testing on Stocks - This will now happen on 19th March.

4. Councillors Reports

Laying of hedge in Pocket Park - The hedge has now been laid by Paul Lewis. It has been inspected and looks good. Cllr Waite suggested that the council should accept it as it is. There are a few places where the boundary could be improved and a few gates that could be used for this purpose. Landscaping may also be possible. A suggestion was made for shrubbery to be put behind the shelter to make the garage less accessible. The Chair spoke to Philip Daynes about reseeding the area in front of the boundary. An invoice has been received from TB Sports Fencing for £672.00 including VAT. TB Sports Fencing have agreed to donate £560.00 to the Claire Purves Memorial Fund if the invoice is paid before 14th March. Thanks were given to TB Sports Fencing for responding so quickly. The fencing will have to stay up until the landscaping has been finalised.

Action: The Clerk to chase Philip Daynes about the reseeding.

HS2 meeting - Cllr Waite is to attend the meeting at SNC offices on Monday 19th March. There may be an opportunity to have an input on footpaths and boundaries.

Diamond Jubilee Celebrations - A tree was ordered and received. It is currently being kept in a pot at Sulgrave Manor.

Flooding in Little Street/Weston (Gated) Road - The Chair investigated the problem and the

pound is permanently under water. There is foul stagnant water next to 2 Manor Cottages which has been reported to Anglian Water.

Action. The Clerk and Cllr Pollak to meet NCC Highways on Wednesday 21st March to look at the problem in further detail.

Tree work - Cllr Pollak had found out that one is obliged to give six weeks notice of an intention to fell trees. SNC are not able to refuse unless they put a tree preservation order onto each tree above a certain diameter. On the application form there is a section which asks if the applicant has the tree owner's permission. The council felt this was a private matter now and they are not able to give any more advice on the matter. They will recommend to the person concerned that they contact SNC themselves or a solicitor.

5. Finance Report

a) Cheques for approval

£30.00 to Miss J Powell (purchase of Royal Oak tree) £28.16 to E.ON UK (light repair) £672.00 to TB Fencing (temporary fence in Pocket Park)

These were proposed by Cllr Pollak and seconded by Cllr Waite.

On two other issues, the Clerk noted that £3096.00 had been transferred from the main account into the Pocket Park account. This was money that had been paid in specifically for Claire Purve's memorial fund. County Councillor Ben Smith had confirmed that he would be able to give a grant of £700.00 which would cover the shortfall in the Pocket Park Renovation Project.

Cllr Pollak expressed concern about the positioning of the proposed zip wire in Pocket Park. Cllr Waite replied that no objections had been raised originally and further detail should be forthcoming nearer the time. The Chair added that the Pocket Park Action Group are still in existence and a meeting will be held in early April to look at the outstanding actions. It is hoped there may be grants available to cover this work.

6. Planning Applications

S/2012/0052/TCA, Removal of 1 silver birch tree at Southlands, Helmdon Road. This was approved by SNC.

7. Correspondence

- CPRE, Planning Explained.
- SNC, Localism Act 2011: Standards. The existing code of conduct will cease to have effect
 and all town and parish councils must adopt a new code of conduct. SNC hope to forward a
 suggested code no later than the beginning of May.

8. Open Forum

Planning Application for Wind Farm at Spring Farm Ridge, land to the north of Welsh Lane between Greatworth and Helmdon

Mr Wootton advised that he had attended a pre-enquiry meeting at SNC on 7^{th} March. The enquiry will commence on 15^{th} May and will last for two weeks. Sittings will be from 10am - 5pm and as many people as possible are being encouraged to turn up on the first day. The Inspector is to visit the whole area on her own before the enquiry starts. She will then have accompanied site visits with both sides. On 21^{st} May, which is the accompanied day site visit, the Action Group are proposing to fly Blimps with permission from the land owners. If this is not possible they will be flown as near to the site as possible. Broadview have changed the position of the turbines slightly but not submitted new photo montages.

Cllr Pollak asked if land owners would be consulted about site visits and the answer was yes. The Parish Council can be represented but it may be a question of time for those who work. The Parish Council will take advice from SNC. The Chair thanked Colin Wootton for providing this information.

H52

Mr Christy gave an update on the HS2 project. The main concern is the route which will affect Sulgrave. The line has been moved closer to Sulgrave and it appears the line will go on higher ground rather than through a large cutting. There will be a clearer definition in a few months time. Mr Christy then spoke about the cost of the exercise to date.

The Transport Minister was asked what money would be spent. The figure quoted was a couple of hundred million. This then changed to £735M and the latest figure is £1.1B which could have been spent without parliamentary approval. Mr Christy advised that the Government are keen to get community forums underway. The contact at Culworth Parish Council is Alan Seeds and there is an advantage with Parish Councils grouping together. There are groups challenging the government consultation process. HS2 Action Alliance is challenging the environmental case, the impact on the environment and Action Alliance who are applying to the European Commission. The Hybrid Bill will be presented on 25^{th} October 2013. There are lots of splinter groups campaigning against HS2 and a public meeting will be held in Brackley Town Hall on 9^{th} March at 7.30pm.

Mrs Burke suggested that the Parish Council do not contribute to CPRE if they show to support HS2. The Chair replied that CPRE do oppose the project but are mitigating the environmental impact. They help the council in other ways. To be discussed at a future meeting date.

Siting of bench

Mr Christy asked about the progress of the siting of the bench outside the shop in memory of John Down. There is an action outstanding against the Parish Council.

Superfast Broadband

Mr Christy asked if any progress had been made with superfast broadband. The Chair advised that Greatworth Park had originally contacted the Parish Council as there is a scheme for superfast Broadband and a possible fund for the communities that are in the 10% hard to reach areas. The exchange at Sulgrave falls into the 10% hard to reach area. Someone needs to gather as many names as possible who are interested in receiving superfast broadband which then forms a 'community'. The bigger the community the better chance there will be of accessing the money in the fund to help deliver superfast broadband. The Parish Council is needed as the 'Lead Representative' and 'Body' adding weight and to supporting the need. There has been a small amount of interest already from the community. Mr Christy agreed to take the project on. Sulgrave Manor asked for any information to be sent to them.

Action: The Parish Clerk to forward the relevant emails that have been circulated to Mr Christy.
