Don't forget to place your orders for your celebrations well in advance with David; the choice from basic essentials to treats are all there on your door step so save on your time & the cost of fuel by continuing to shop locally. Have a look at the bottled beers & wines whilst your in the Shop, maybe celebrate with one of the sparkling wines that are now in stock at very affordable prices.

The weather last month really effected us in many ways; David was told me earlier that we sold 8 times the number of kindling wood boxes in April versus the same 4 weeks last year when the sun shone! The arrival of the English asparagus was also delayed but I'm delighted to say that it's now in stock & selling well; there's nothing quite like it.

The joint promotion with Mandy & Will at the Star ended on April 30th & again despite the weather, David handed out 24 vouchers to our customers allowing them to claim a £5 discount off their food bill when they eat at the Star before May 31st; don't let those vouchers lapse & thank you again for your support. We should also be proud of the Shop's overall financial performance for the first 4 months of 2012; Asda's like for like sales were up by 2.2% on 2011 whilst both Tesco & Morrisons were down ... our Shop takings were up by 2.4%. I know that I sound like a cracked record each month but things are positive within our Shop so thank you again for your support! We mustn't rest on our laurels though. Please do let us know if there are things that you would like to see in the Shop or new services that you think that we should consider.
