

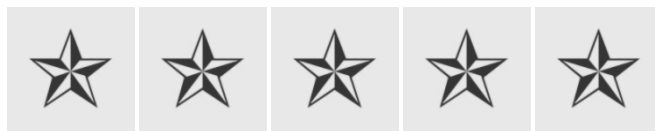

Village Shop News Update

Things are starting to happen down at our Shop in more ways than one!

First, I'm delighted to report that the Shop turnover for August compared to the same month last year is 10% up which is fantastic news so a **BIG** thank you to everyone who's helped with this both as customers & our volunteers. We need both to make it happen & the results are looking good.

The Management Committee are also now working on the comments arising both from the research that we conducted earlier in the year & to those that have been made to us directly. You will have seen, & hopefully experienced our new Post Office opening hours & services. By the time that you read this, the Management Committee will have met to agree a plan to also address the decoration & layout of our Shop which I think we all agree are areas needing attention.

Following your concerned comments about the periods when the Shop has to be closed for a few minutes during the day, with immediate effect, we've revised this so that you will see a 'Back in 5 minutes' notice on the door early in the afternoon each Tuesday, Thursday & Friday (& it will be for 5 minutes!) except for Wednesdays when the Shop will be closed between 2pm & 2.45pm, NOT 2.30pm & 3.15pm as previously stated, allowing David to complete important Post Office administration.

Finally, please note that our Post Office, NOT the Shop, will be closed from Friday 7th & will re-open on Tuesday, October 18th as David takes a well holiday.

Please keep giving us your thoughts & suggestions; it's your Shop & we need to know that it's giving you what you need both in products and services.

WINTER SQUASH
EXCITING VARIETY NOW IN STOCK
at Sulgrave Village Shop



With names including Acorn, Custard Marrow, Delicata, Turks Turban, Gem and even Spaghetti, who could resist trying a recipe or two?

WINTER SQUASH

Most winter squash are best either roast or sautéed, as this brings out their sweetness and true flavours, all of which are subtly different. Cut into chunks, season well and roast for about 1 hour according to size.

They are also great curried, combined with potato, spinach and fresh coriander, or simply as an addition to meat dishes.

The Custard and Sunburst Marrows that are perhaps not as flavoursome as the others, benefit from being stuffed with either meats or other vegetables - or a combination - as they absorb the flavours with which they are cooked. Cook meats thoroughly before stuffing the squash then cook on a medium heat for about 1-1½ hours til fully tender.

The Spaghetti Squash is a real treat - bake whole and the flesh becomes spaghetti like - but without the calories!

The Acorn, the Onion and the Harlequin Square can be used as a desert! De-seed, bake until soft then sprinkle with brown sugar and dribble with maple syrup or honey.

You can even eat the seeds! Rinse in cold water to remove any fleshy fibres, toss with a little salt and bake. Add to salads or eat as a tasty snack.

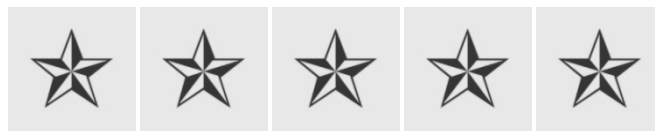

It has been a feature of life in Sulgrave for many, many years with meetings held monthly in the Church Hall and, more latterly at Sulgrave Manor. However, since 2005 the Society has functioned on a project only basis, with occasional open meetings/events to present the results of our activities. These latter have hardly been well attended, which begs the question, does Sulgrave want the Society to continue

If the answer is yes, then in what form? And, following on from an affirmative response, who is willing to join the Committee to help arrange and organise future activities'?

The Archaeology Group is still a functioning concern as its project still has two years to run. But once completed, with we hope, final publication of the Sulgrave Castle Excavations Report, its immediate purpose will have come to an end.

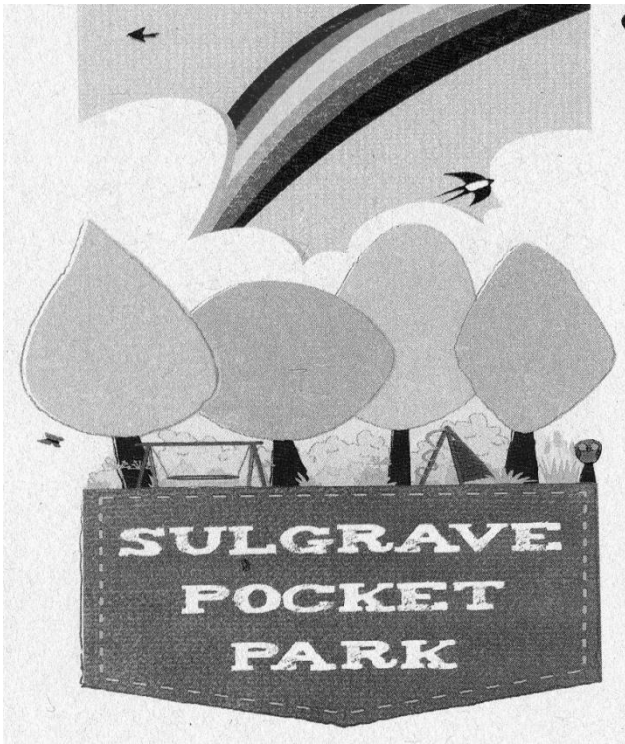
