Draft Notes from Parish Council Meeting held 14th June 2012

To approve and sign the minutes of last meeting held on 10th May 2012

These minutes were all approved and accepted by the council. Proposed by Cllr Roberts and seconded by Cllr Harding.

<u>Matters Arising</u>

A vote of thanks was passed to the Jubilee Committee on a very enjoyable event.

<u>To consider the Code of Conduct adopted by South Northants Council and the following</u> <u>resolutions</u>:

- 4a. The Code of Conduct annexed and expected to be adopted by South Northamptonshire Council be adopted as the code for members and co-opted members of the Sulgrave Parish Council with effect from 1 July 2012, or such other date as may be specified in regulations, to replace the current Code of Conduct; and
- 4b. The Clerk be requested to notify the Monitoring Officer of South Northamptonshire Council of the passing of the above resolution

This was accepted by the council, proposed by Cllr Waite and seconded by Cllr Roberts.

Siting of mew cableway in Pocket Park

The proposed new cableway will run adjacent to the football pitch and next to the

hedge line of plum suckers and overgrowth. It would be placed on the north side of Pocket Park. John Hicks, who normally carries out the safety inspection, has commented that the cableway runs near to trees which would have to be cut back. There is concern there may be collisions and a suggestion was made to plant silver birch trees to prevent this. However these types of tree grow fast. Another suggestion made was to plant a low hedge or bushes which would be easier to manage. It was agreed the proposal should go ahead and then assess afterwards if any additional planting is needed. Cllr Waite proposed that the council accept the proposal of the new cableway and this was seconded by Cllr Harding. The cableway will be installed by Tony Patten. The Parish Council to order the zip wire.

Action: Tony Patten to show his insurance details and a method statement before work commences.

<u>To receive an update on HS2</u>

Cllr Waite noted he has attended a number of meetings and there is lots of detail, such as the proposed route on the HS2 website. Minutes of community forum meetings are on the website. The next forum meeting is on 19th June at Aston Le Walls and he asked councillors to look at their diaries as he is unable to attend that meeting. He feels it is important that Sulgrave is represented at these meetings. There is a small group working together, Culworth, Thorpe Mandeville and Greatworth who are influencing the route at Lower Thorpe. There is a proposed variation in terms of level to lessen the impact.

Councillors Reports

Diamond Jubilee Weekend

Cllr Powell reported that there are mugs to be delivered from the Diamond Jubilee weekend. Cllr Roberts reported that he has sent a letter to the Nationwide Building Society about the transfer of the Silver Jubilee fund to the Diamond Jubilee fund. Thanks was given to Rodney Henn for his support.

Beech trees by Stocks

Cllr Pollak has received the written report from the company who tested the beech trees by the Stocks. One tree did not need testing which saved the council £200. There were minor changes to the second tree and this will need a retest in two years.

Planning Application – Belmont, Little Street

Cllr Waite noted the meeting was held at SNC today to discuss the planning application at Belmont House, Little Street. SNC decided they would defer this until their next meeting He thanked the following people for being able to attend the meeting, Cllr Pollak, Mr and Mrs Blayney and Mr Christy. The Parish Council consider the application to be too dense and overbearing on surrounding properties. From the meeting, it was agreed that local councillors would be visiting the site as they are not aware of the local area and the impact it would have on the village. The Parish Council see this as an opportunity to respond and provide an alternative proposal. Cllr Waite is willing to put something together which would be less offensive and look out towards the Manor. Cllr Waite asked for permission from the Council to draw up and submit an alternative scheme for Belmont and all councillors agreed to this. Cllr Waite to speak to Cllr Davies about how to present the alternative proposal.

Siting of bench by the Shop

Cllr Waite advised that he has submitted the planning application to SNC for the placing of a bench in memory of John Down, the postman.

High Speed Broadband

Cllr Waite spoke about high speed broadband and had circulated an email about it. Only one response has been received to date. Anybody with concerns should approach the Parish Council who may be able to help.

Parking Scheme at Spinners Cottages

Cllr Waite reported that approval has been given for the new parking scheme at Spinners Cottages with conditions. The Highways Authority have also given their approval with more conditions attached. One of the conditions is for the applicant to pay for any works to apparatus. Cllr Waite has written to South Northants Homes asking for further details. Full engineering drawings are to be submitted.

Finance Report

- <u>To approve and sign Sections 1 and 2 of the Annual Return 2011/12</u> The Annual Return was presented to the Council, approved and signed by the Chair and Responsible Financial Officer.

<u>Planning Applications</u>

One new application had been received since the last meeting.

S/2012/0582/FUL, Conservatory to side of 5 Towrise. The Council has commented on the application and it will be determined by SNC.

<u>Correspondence</u>

• Audit Commission, Consultation of external auditor for 2012/13 and future years. The proposal is to re-appoint BDO LLP to audit the annual return of Sulgrave Parish Council for five years from 2012/13. Scales of fees have been adjusted for smaller bodies based on bands of income and expenditure whichever is the higher. The fees will be proportionate to the public funds involved and the ability of the body to pay.

Open Forum

• Cllr Waite reported that street lighting is still outstanding and this will be discussed in more detail at the next meeting. It will be an ongoing project which could last 5-10 years.

Action: The Parish Clerk to circulate the latest email to all councillors.

- Mrs Blayney thanked the Parish Council and village for their support during the Diamond Jubilee weekend.
- Cllr Roberts noted that he will continue to support the church hall and report back at the next meeting, as promised. Cllr Powell agreed to help. The hall is not used very much and could be upgraded.

Action: Cllr Roberts to first talk to Robin Prior.
