It's hard to believe that the summer holidays are almost over for another year ... it's been a pleasure to see more of our young people in the shop over the last few weeks and we wish every one of them all the very best as they go into a new class, move school, start university or take the first step towards their future career !

#### Shop performance year to date

Again it's great to be able to report that the shop continues to thrive. July was another very strong month with turnover up by nearly 6% on last year which makes it our second best month this year. The first couple of weeks of August are just as promising with both weeks up 14% and 8% respectively ... amazing when so many of the villagers are typically away on holiday! Although we know that alcohol, newspapers, specialist groceries, tobacco and greeting cards are the main areas up on the same period last year, we have yet to undertake a detailed analysis of where the increased custom is coming from. Is it from within the village? Are our existing customers spending more or are more villagers using us? Or could it be that the leaflet drop (to villages within a 5 mile radius) for the 'Community Shop Fortnight' is having the desired effect? We'll keep you posted but in the meantime if anyone has any thoughts and/or feedback on this it would be very welcome.

#### Volunteer coverage for David's summer holiday

The management committee would like to say a 'HUGE' thank you to all those who went over and above the call of duty to provide cover for David's holiday. Given that it was the month of August and several volunteers were away too, those who were around put in a tremendous effort and kept everything running very smoothly. We really are very lucky to have such a dedicated team who  $\checkmark$  our shop and do a fantastic job !

Up-date on projects

We shared our progress in relation to various projects being undertaken at the AGM. These include a new EPOS system, a community defibrillator and a local business directory so that we can ensure that our shop is more than just a shop. The management committee will be meeting again shortly to review the progress made over the summer. We will keep you posted.

In the meantime hopefully you've noticed the new Post Office sign and the difference it makes to the outside appearance of the shop. Another 'BIG' thank you to Paul Crowley and Graham Roberts who with much effort managed to detach the old sign, clean it up and replace the logo ... something that was much easier said than done! 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
