The latest regulation about customers having to wear facemasks when entering a shop will, of course, impact upon us but, as always, I am sure the shop will cope. For customers that do not have their own facemask, we shall have some for sale at a nominal price at the shop door, though, if possible, please bring your own.

Since the easing of regulations, the shop and Post Office have been extremely busy and our volunteers and staff have really been burning the calories. Yet again we would like to ask those volunteers who followed lock-down advice and stayed at home during the peak of the crisis, to consider returning to duty – you would be extremely welcome. The shop now has Perspex screens in front of both the shop and Post Office tills - and plastic face visors can be issued to any volunteer who offers to serve. Please come back, we need you!

Although we are still operating a system of one customer in the shop at a time, this has not impacted on sales and for the past month the shop has been buzzing. Thanks to the genius of our volunteer handy-man Clive Nicholls and the display skills of our supervisors, the shop is looking fantastic and many customers have commentated on how good it looks and how lucky we are to have such a brilliant shop on our doorstep. Lucky indeed!

The move to a daily collection of fruit and vegetables by our volunteers means that all our produce is super-fresh and this has met with wide-spread approval. The fresh strawberries have been particularly appreciated and just fly off the shelves.

The epidemic appears not to have impacted on our wine consumption and the sight of Digby pushing a wheel-barrow piled high with wine to restock the shelves has become almost a daily event in the village. We try to ring the changes on the wine front and this month there will be some new toothsome and great value Spanish reds which would make a perfect choice to accompany a barbecue - to which end we now have bags of charcoal back in stock.

Some new lines this month are a tasty looking range of Farmhouse Biscuits, Nevis Sultana cake, two flavours of Olinas seeded toasts for cheese or dips and some fancy crisp flavours. How does 'smoked pheasant and wild mushroom' grab you?

After disappointing weather throughout July, let's hope that the sunshine returns in August. The seventh of August is International Beer Day so do take advantage of our splendid range of locally brewed beers to celebrate the event.

## Summary of Parish Council Meeting conducted by "Zoom" technology. Thursday 2nd July

The chairman opened the meeting by welcoming Mr Mike Powell of 9 Spinners cottages to the meeting, and he was duly co opted on to the council. The parish council has now it's full compliment of six members.

The model standing orders, and financial regulations were then approved.

The idea of a village library had the full support of the council. The chairman reported that the P.C.C had agreed to have the library in the Church. Two volunteers had come forward to set it up and Councillor Priestman would be the council representative. So a library run by the council with the full support of the Church. To be proceeded with when Covid restrictions allow.

An event for the whole village to be held on Castle green on the 19th of September, was agreed. Websters to put on a village picnic. Further details in the August newsletter. An event that not only brings the village together, but will act as a fundraiser for Brackley Community Hospital.

Great improvements to the allotments, with only one unused plot. The council had paid for the ditch to be cleared out. The chairman thanked Graham Trower for getting the small digger and with his many helpers getting the job done.

Councillor Priestman reported that the solar speed sign would soon be installed in Helmdon Rd

Pocket park to be opened on July 4th with appropriate signage.

Street signs to be re painted in Helmdon Rd and Spinners cottages. New sign to be asked for Manor Rd

Church Hall improvements. Andrew Dixon, on behalf of the Parochial Church Council, had sent a comprehensive report, updating the council on progress. Grant from HS2 soon to be released enabling estimates to be got for work..

Neil Higginson reported on grass cutting . All agreed on the excellence of our contractor and will sign him up for another three years on the same terms. N.C.C will come and tidy up ash tree in church lane. All other trees under care of council to assessed under duty of care. The Council unanimously expressed its thanks to Ingram Lloyd for her work in reseeding the grass triangle at the junction of School Street and Church Street.
