The annual general meeting of the shop was held on 21st September. There was a decent turn-out of 28 people – BUT they were all the old familiar faces. The presentation of the Queen's Award by the Lord Lieutenant of Northamptonshire, which had been scheduled for the middle of September was postponed following the announcement of the death of the Queen. The presentation has now been rescheduled for **Friday 14th October between 2.00 and 3.30pm at the Shop premises**. Refreshments will be provided, and the event will be covered by the local press - so please do turn up.

To celebrate 18 years of the shop's operation, Colin Wootton has produced a lovely little booklet (illustrated by Colin's wonderful photographs) detailing its history. It will be on sale in the shop at the cost price of $\pounds 2$.
