# **Co-option of New Councillor**

Sarah Parker was co-opted onto the Council and welcomed by all.

# **Matters Arising from the Minutes of the Previous Meeting**

Gigaclear have started work on the installation of Full Fibre Broadband in the village.

The Castle Green wall is to be repaired later this month.

# High Speed Rail (HS2)

In the absence of **CIIr Staples**, the Chair reported on HS2 works, to the effect that the Banbury Road is to be closed for a month from October 31<sup>st</sup>.

### Sulgrave Manor.

Cllr Priestman reported that the Manor will be closed for the season from October 31st.

#### Pocket Park.

The Safety Report was discussed. The Chair, **Cllr Richard Fonge**, reported that he and **Tony Keatley** had renewed some worn shackles on the swings. The Zip Wire is to be serviced soon. A quote for a new double swing was discussed. **Cllr Staples** to talk to HS2 on funding for this. The Chair had been unable to mow the Park, so his grandson had done the last three and will finish the season. The Council agreed to pay him £30 a cut. The quote from C.M.G., the village grass contractors, had been £65 a cut.

#### Library.

The pews have now been removed. **CIIr Peppiatt** reported that the quote for a new carpet of £1200 plus, was equal to one from P.C.C. Council agreed was too expensive. **CIIr Peppiatt** to investigate further cheaper options.

Sulgrave Chronicles.

**Martin Sirrot-Smith** reported that the new edition was ready for printing by Amazon. The Council backed the promotion of forward buying at a discount price. Details to be published in the October Village Newsletter.

Additional ParishCouncillor.

All agreed that Clerk should set in motion the procedure to increase Council from six to seven members.
