Farthinghoe Bypass.

A request from Farthinghoe Parish Council to sign a petition to West Northants Council to re-instate the Farthinghoe bypass onto their highway works agenda was unanimously agreed.

V.E. Day.

Cllr **Sarah Parker** showed the poster Cllr **Jo Peppiatt** had designed to advertise the Pocket Park picnic to celebrate V.E Day on Saturday 10th May. Fully approved by all.
